#### PULTENEY FREE LIBRARY

This is a "progress report" to the community about the Pulteney Free Library's efforts to address problems of funding, space, and the future.

Many members of our community have expressed concern and support for the Library as we plan the next steps in the process. We appreciate the generous response to our Annual Membership Campaign, and the outpouring of moral sup-

port! Now, the Trustees are working on the immediate issues of operating funding and space.

We have to meet three basic needs in order to serve as the community's Library:

- 1. Funding to continue the amount which has been the annual Town of Pulteney contribution for Library support,
- 2. An additional sum to pay for the use of the current space in the Town Hall heat, light, water and
- 3. An amount to cover the annual shortfall which is currently drawn from our limited reserve funds.

As you know, many libraries have a line in the annual budgets of their local school systems. However for libraries like ours, which are located in more than one school system, there's a special process in the New York State Education Law. It's called a "Chapter 414" process. Chapter 414 allows a library to have its own separate line in the Town's budget. This is different from prior years because it would require funding dedicated to the Library directly.

During the next few weeks, PFL Trustees will be asking registered voters to sign a petition so that the 414 process can take place. The petition will ask for a question to be placed on the November 2013 ballot, so voters can decide whether to allow Pulteney Free Library to have a separate line in the Town's annual budget.

The total request to the taxpayers of Pulteney will be approximately 60% of the Pulteney Free Library's budget. The balance of 40% comes from citizen contributions, memorials and honorary donations, and various grants. The only way the requested amount would increase or decrease is through another vote by taxpayers.

Of course the remaining issue – a permanent home – remains an ongoing concern for all of us. The Board of Trustees, the Library Director and assistant, and many Pulteney residents are working hard to find a secure, appropriate, affordable, safe space to call home.

#### PULTENEY COMMUNITY GARDEN

The Pulteney Community Garden Project has really began to take root this year. We have graciously received a total of \$600 in monetary donations from Keuka Brewery, Jan Stone, and the Presbytery. In addition we have received in-kind donations from Terry Gibson and Jane Russell that will assist with construction of beds and watering. We are exploring a new permanent sign for the location.

Recently, the project committee was approached regarding a local teenager completing his Eagle Badge at the garden. Brian Kilbury, a boy scout with Troop 18 of Hammondsport and who resides in Pulteney, will be joining us in our endeavor. He has wonderful plans and a drive to include as many local business as possible. The focus of his project will include creating 4 raised beds at the front of the garden lot. We are very excited to have him on board. We are currently having meetings on the third Thursday of the month from 6-7pm at the town hall. There was a work day on May 18 to start creating gardens and work on construction of beds. ## **Consumer Directed Services**



A well-informed consumer knows to call NYCONNECTS at the Steuben County Office for the Aging when the need for in-home help arises, regardless of age or income level. Sadly, some discover that there is a workforce

shortage and a waiting list for services. This may strike you as odd given the high rate of unemployment! The reasons for this are complex, but there is a solution that is gaining more and more attention these days. Read on!

Consumer directed programs allow the consumer to choose a friend, neighbor, or even a family member in some cases, to complete the necessary in-home tasks and receive payment for this. While a neighbor may not be interested in a career as a home care worker, she may be willing to assist you, because of your long standing friendship. You designate what and how and when the services are delivered, and the agency of your choosing is the employer of record for your worker. Services are paid for under Medicaid or private pay. Steuben County residents may even be able to get consumer directed services with a sliding fee scale under an Office for the Aging home care program.

There are some specific requirements for the program that you need to understand before you sign up. NY-CONNECTS staff is well-versed on the ins and outs of consumer directed services and we would be happy to discuss your individual situation. If you decide it is right for you, we can even make the referral for you. Call us at 1-866-221-7324 and we will walk you through the options.
