Fall is a good time to get ready for the winter heating season. Ensure your house has working Carbon Monoxide (CO) and smoke detectors in your house and that the batteries have been checked or replaced. CO detectors older than 7 years and smoke detectors older than 10 years should be replaced. This is also the time to have your chimney cleaned and to make sure your heating equipment is ready.

The Ambulance Corps recommends having a File of Life or a list of medications and any out-of-hospital directives (DNR, MOLST, etc.) easily found during an emergency. The best place is your refrigerator.

PULTENEY TOWN NEWS

Greetings from the Pulteney Town Hall!

As I write this note to you, it is the week after Labor Day and Summer is passing into Autumn. What a great time of year to live here in Pulteney--there is lots going on and I will share some of the highlights:

Tennis/Pickle Ball Court: We finally have paved the new area and are waiting to get the line painting finished, replace some of the fencing, and we will be ready to go. We are not happy how long this project has taken, but it will be done soon.

Ambulance Garage: We have reached a formal agreement with the Pulteney Fire Department for them to assume ownership of the building on January 1, 2020. This date will allow them to develop a budget and be ready to take ownership of the building. The parcel where the building sits has been sub-divided and the Town will continue to own the community garden area, pavilion, and pond on the back side. Great cooperation between the Town and the Fire Department on this project.

Road Repairs and Upgrades: Terry Gibson and the Highway Crew have worked around the raindrops this summer to complete our scheduled upgrades and annual road maintenance. It is always great to see the shared services program at work as other Towns have helped us with projects and we in turn assist neighboring Towns when needed. This shared services program is managed by our own Terry Gibson and the nearby Highway Superintendents. It is a great example of Government working at the local level. Our thanks to all involved.

2020 Town Budget: We have already started work on preparing the Town's budget for next year. The process starts with a look at the projects we need to budget for next year. The Town Board has met with members of our Departments to begin the process. We are obligated by law to have the budget completed in November and will hold a public hearing at either our October or November meeting. At the public hearing, the Board will present the budget to the community and receive any input.

Election Day 2020: Is right around the corner--make sure that you are registered to vote and please plan to vote on November 5th at the Ross Memorial Library. We have several local contests and it is the most imperative way you can influence your local Government is by Voting!

ORGAN REDEDICATION

The Presbyterian Church will be rededicating their 1897 Beman Pipe Organ on October 20 at 2:00.

The Pulteney Presbyterian organ has been lovingly maintained ever since its purchase. Few changes have been made. In 1980 a new blower and new access into the swell box were added. The reservoir was re-leathered in 1990. The organ has its original cabinet, as well as the ebony and ivory keys. The tin pipes are original, as are the paint and stencils.

The restoration was done by Parsons Pipe Organ.

Scheduled appointments are required on a first come first serve basis. You will be directed to call Medicare or apply online when appointment times have been filled. NOTE: if you receive extra help or have Medicaid your appointment will be scheduled AFTER this Open Enrollment period.

This year's HEAP season will open on Tuesday, November 12, 2019.
