Hello All,

As I write this letter, the smell of grapes is in the fresh air of Pulteney and the trees are just starting to turn. I am writing to ask for your support for our requested tax increase. This year we are asking for an increase in the taxes used to support our Library.

The total amount requested from the taxpayers will be \$45,110. This equates to a tax rate per thousand dollar of assessment value at \$0.1534. Or, to state this differently, if this proposal passes and your home is assessed at \$50,000, you would pay \$7.67/year to support our Library.

I have some audited data from 2020 that shows the comparison of local libraries:
